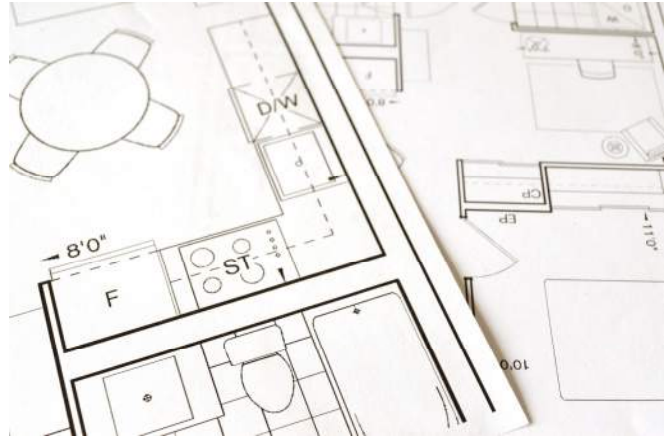

Effective Use of the Milestone

Beware of the contractor that states “there’s only one date that matters”.

A statement like that usually indicates an absence of control and accountability. At the outset of your project, make it a point to establish and agree upon milestone objectives. Each milestone must be clearly defined and must have a name that means something to the entire team.



As the project progresses, team members must be sensitive to impediments that would prevent reaching each successive milestone. Reward and celebrate when a milestone is achieved on time. Appreciate those who state “we missed the milestone” when it’s missed. Beware of those who seek to redefine, or rename a milestone as its objective date draws near or passes.
